Dear Pennsauken residents,

Earlier this week, the County readjusted [our numbers](#) in regards to residents passing away from COVID-19 complications. And unfortunately, it's in the opposite direction than last time. Our numbers have moved back up to 25 fatalities; and today's totals brought us to 1,004 positive cases. One life lost is one too many; and the impact the coronavirus has had on our community is still very concerning. But we have to keep properly wearing face masks, washing our hands frequently, and maintaining social distancing. We must rely on ourselves, not anyone else, to keep this virus at bay.

We also have to prepare for flu season. The Camden County Department of Health and Human Services recommends everyone get a flu shot, especially children and seniors who are most vulnerable. The deadline to register for next month's general election is Tuesday, Oct. 13. You can now do so electronically. The New Jersey online voter registration website can be found at <https://voter.svrs.nj.gov/register>. We've also had many of our residents submit their vote-by-mail ballots at our secure drop box, located outside of the Township Building, 5605 N. Crescent Blvd. It's a great option to make sure that your vote is counted. You can also place your ballot in the mail, making sure your ballot is postmarked by Nov. 3 or deliver it to your polling place by 8:00 p.m. on Nov. 3. Learn more [here](#).

Look for a video from us soon about how we're planning to keep kids safe while they enjoy this fun holiday. Also, we're hosting a fun event that will also help some of our residents in need. The Township is having a drive-in showing of "Hocus Pocus" in our municipal parking lot on Saturday, Oct. 24, at 6:30 p.m. The event is free, but you must pre-register.
